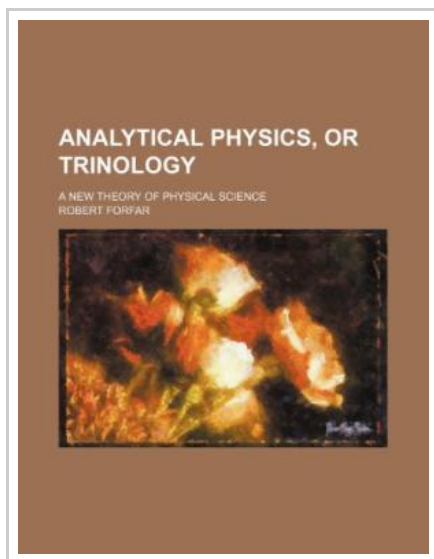

Almost all the phenomena in nature are deducible from a final cause, -- heat, cold, and water being the three primary elements, which, co-operating together like the changes in bellringing, produce the endless manifestations which everywhere meet the eye. 152. Thus water, with small mixtures of glutinous or carbonic substances, produces, on the application of heat, spirits and gases. Corn, or grains of wheat laid on a tablet of glass, covered with a layer of straw only, may be made to grow on the application of heat and water. This experiment, performed on a large scale for a number of years, would cause the produce, from its own decay yearly, to form soil, on which plants would grow.
